Budget Committee Meeting Public Hearing – 2018 Municipal Budget Wednesday, February 14, 2018

These minutes were recorded by Ellen White, Town Administrator. The meeting was held in the Bub Avery Memorial Gymnasium at Town Hall.

Call to Order:

Chairman Goss called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

Goss opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance:

Joseph Goss, Chairman; Donna Gridley; Jonathan Smith; Marie McConarty, Ctr. Ossipee Fire Rep.; Louise Sutherland, West Ossipee Fire Rep.; Lynne Parker, Ossipee Corner Fire Rep.; Sandra "Sam" Martin, Selectmen's Rep.; and Ellen White, Town Administrator. Other attendance from the public are addressed by name in these minutes.

Public Hearing:

Goss requested that all persons wishing to speak state their name and residence, and to also direct all questions through the Chairman.

Goss then started the operating budget review by announcing each budget line-by-line (copy attached), and then moved onto read the warrant articles (copy attached).

Children Unlimited, Inc. – Joann Kelly, Executive Director, was present to review the petitioned warrant article request in the amount of \$3,000. Kelly spoke about Children's Unlimited being the resource center for Carroll County for the past eight years and provided an overview of the program which provides home visits based on referrals given by the Division of Children, Youth and Families, schools, community and Head Start. She also reviewed the statistics for families assisted from the Town of Ossipee which was 17 since 7/1/2017. Kelly provided the financial statements for review. Review and discussion ensued. McConarty made a motion to recommend the request from Children Unlimited, Inc. in the amount of \$3,000. Sutherland seconded. A unanimous vote was taken.

White Horse Addiction Center – Mitch Yeaton, Founder, was present to review the petitioned warrant article request in the amount of \$5,000. Yeaton reviewed the services provided stating 40% of the clients served come from Ossipee. A review of expenditures and funding sources took place. Florence Lemay questioned if any clients are turned away. Yeaton responded that all are welcomed as a guest and are treated with dignity and respect. Robert Freeman noted this as a great service to the Town. Goss stated that the Budget Committee has already made their recommendation on this article.

Brad Harriman, Public Works Director, spoke on the Capital Reserve Funds related to the Water & Sewer System that have been proposed. He stated the although it has not been mandated by NH DES at this time, upgrades to the infrastructure may be required in the near future that could be upwards of \$4-5 million. The proposed Capital Reserve Funds are a great way to start saving toward infrastructure improvements. Martin stated the establishment of these warrant articles has the support of the Selectmen. Smith reviewed research he conducted where only 7% of the Town utilizes the public utilities and if a minimal fee had been assessed to each ratepayer 15 years ago, there would be money raised each year than proposed. He also stated that if the system experiences a catastrophic failure, the Town would be responsible for the repair. Harriman stated that he appreciates the thought process and noted that the leak found on Pine River Road consumed half of the reserve funds to repair this year alone. Gridley stated that she would like to see a plan for the funds.

Joseph Deighan stated the system needs to be run like a business and determination needs to be made as to whether the money is being used correctly. He questioned whether the Department has a deficit or surplus each year. Harriman responded that there is approximately \$88,000 available at the end of each year which is then transferred to the existing Capital Reserve Funds used for system repairs and maintenance. Lynne Parker stated that the repairs completed this year were excellent progress in sustaining the system and the awareness that improvements are needed in the future is present.

Smith reviewed the cost associated with a private well and septic, the cost to have the septic pumped and for electricity to run a well pump.

Condict Billings, Trustee of Trust Funds, stated that there are already two Capital Reserve Funds established and the Town cannot commingle tax dollars to fund the system. He also discussed issues with the current Capital Reserve Funds where there is no purpose stated for their use.

Goss stated the total for warrant articles as recommended is \$754,939. The total for estimated revenues is \$2,596,195. The amount to be raised by taxation is \$4,029,946. Last year's figure was in the amount of \$3,732,001, an increase of \$297,945.

Carl Huddleston, West Ossipee Fire Chief, presented the budget for the West Ossipee Fire Precinct as follows:

Jim Spencer, Ossipee Corner Fire Precinct Commissioner, presented the budget for the Ossipee Corner Fire Precinct as follows:

Spencer stated they will be paying off a loan this year but will be taking the payment amount and putting it in the Capital Reserve Fund to help build it toward future equipment purchases. \$25,000 from surplus will be used to purchase apparatus.

Smith questioned what the tax impact will be on the \$297,945 overall increase in the Town budget. White responded that this has not been estimated.

Goss stated there are openings on the Budget Committee.

Being no further input, Gridley made a motion to adjourn. Sutherland seconded. A unanimous vote was taken.
