Selectmen's Work Session Monday, March 22, 2021

The following meeting was held in the upstairs conference room at Town Hall. Present were Selectmen Martha Eldridge, Susan Simpson and Jonathan Smith. Matt Sawyer Jr., Town Administrator was also present, and recorded the minutes.

Chairman Smith called the meeting to order at 2:30 PM

Discussion:

Smith made a motion to enter 2 consecutive non-public sessions:

- 1) Under RSA 91-A:3, II(b) for the hiring of a public employee
- 2) Under RSA 91-A:3, II(d) for the sale or acquisition of property

Eldridge seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken: Simpson-YES; Eldridge-YES; Smith-YES

At 3:06 PM Smith made a motion to re-enter the public meeting and seal the minutes to both non-public sessions. Simpson seconded and the vote passed unanimously.

At 3:15 Smith made a motion to accept and send the Tax Deeding Letter as drafted, to those property owners that have outstanding 2018 taxes. Eldridge seconded and the vote passed unanimously.

TJ Eldridge joined the group, who then reviewed the job descriptions Sawyer had created for the Part Time Sporadic Transfer Station Operator, and the Cemeteries Groundskeeper. Sawyer was instructed to make minor edits and get them posted as edited.

The Board told TJ to get one or two more quotes on the Dam Engineering if possible, and to then go ahead and order the work per the warrant article that passed at Town Meeting.

At 3:45, The Board reviewed an application by Ossipee Main Street regarding the signage for historical Town buildings. The Board said Sawyer was authorized to complete the paperwork and go forward with it from there.

There was a quick conversation regarding the use of Town facilities for private events. The consensus was that any decision to re-open that availability would have to wait pending the Governor and the current emergency orders.

Being no further input, the work session recessed until 4:15 in the gym.
